Hancock has five years of teaching experience, coming to us from Corinth High School. With the retirement last spring of Shannon Garner a position opened up in the Math Department, and Hancock was eager to accept. She is teaching Algebra II and Geometry this year. Both courses inexam that measures student achievement as part of the TNReady initiative.

"TNReady is a part of the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP) and is designed to assess true student understanding, not just basic memorization and test-taking skills.
