“Newest” Member of the 1,000 Point Club

1984 graduate Angela Walker Robinson was surprised on February 28 with a basketball representing her membership in the 1,000 Point Club at MCHS. Robinson scored her 1,000th point on February 22, 1984 against McKenzie. Somehow, the achievement was overlooked, and Robinson was

never recognized as a member.

The MCHS Sports Hall of Fame found the oversight when committee member Christopher Moore digitized the scorebooks into a stat program.

Robinson was presented the basketball by Coach Jerry Lott during a surprise visit at Pickwick Elec-

tric, where Robinson has worked for many years. Co-workers helped out with the surprise of the former Lady Bobcat, who has spent many hours promoting the MCHS basketball program. She joins multiple family members in the club, including the leading scorer of all time, brother Neal “Sky” Walker.

Robinson’s final point total was 1,049. She went on to play basketball at Jackson State Community College, and was inducted into the Jackson-Madison County Sports Hall of Fame. At JSCC, she was named to the All-TN Junior College Athletic Association, All-Region 7, and as the Most Valuable Player
