- Students are exempt from final exams ONLY if they have no more than one unexcused absence in the class or have an "A" average. Students need to check with each teacher to see if they are exempt.

- All teachers will be giving final exams on these two days including courses with End-of-Course (EOC) exams.

- Students will be allowed to leave at the end of the testing period if they have transportation. Buses will run at regular times.

- Students who are exempt from exams do not need to be present on these two days.
